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## ***UNICEF a Eurochild yn lansio arolwg ar yr Ewrop a Garai Plant***

Ar 06 Mehefin 2018, lansiodd Eurochild a UNICEF arolwg ar-lein i gasglu barn plant a phobl ifanc ynghylch dyfodol Ewrop.

Mae arolwg 'Yr Ewrop a Garai Plant' yn cynnwys pynciau fel profiad plant o fywyd teuluol, yr ysgol, cymdeithas, a'u meddyliau ynghylch Ewrop. Mae wedi'i ysgrifennu mewn iaith sy'n ddealladwy i blant, yn y gobaith y bydd hynny'n annog rhai o dan 18 oed i ymateb.

Datblygwyd yr arolwg gan arbenigwyr hawliau plant, ac mae ysgolion a chyrrff eraill sy'n gweithio gyda phlant a phobl ifanc yn cael eu hannog i ddefnyddio'r canllawiau a ddarparwyd i ysgogi trafodaethau ar y cwestiynau.

Bydd yr arolwg yn cael ei gynnal tan 21 Medi 2018.

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## ***Llywodraeth Cymru yn ceisio barn ar gynigion i leihau allyriadau Cymru***

Mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn ymgynghori ar ei chynigion newydd i leihau allyriadau yng Nghymru gan 80% yn 2050.

Mae'r cynigion yn disgrifio'r targedau y bydd Llywodraeth Cymru yn eu gosod rhwng nawr a 2050, (i'w cymeradwyo gan y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol) a'r cynlluniau bydd yn eu defnyddio i leihau allyriadau.

Dywed Llywodraeth Cymru fod cyfran fawr o ynni Cymru yn dal i ddod o danwyddau ffosil a bod gennym gyfran uchel o ddiwydiant trwm yng Nghymru, a bod nifer o heriau eraill sy'n benodol i Gymru.

Mae cynigion Llywodraeth Cymru yn cynnwys cynyddu nifer y ffynonellau adnewyddadwy ynni sy'n cael eu defnyddio i eneradu pŵer yng Nghymru, creu rhwydwaith teithio dim carbon, annog pobl yng Nghymru i ddefnyddio cerbydau trydanol, ac archwilio a defnyddio technoleg newydd mewn dulliau effeithiol i helpu i leihau ein hallyriadau.

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## ***Panel Ymgynghorol Ieuenctid Into Film Cymru yn chwilio am aelodau newydd***

Elusen addysgol yw Into Film sy'n ceisio rhoi ffilm wrth galon profiad dysgu a diwylliannol plant a phobl ifanc. Mae eu rhaglen sy'n cwmpasu'r DU gyfan yn cynnig cyfleoedd i bobl ifanc 5-19 oed weld, meddwl, gwneud a dychmygu - gan gyfrannu at eu datblygiad addysgol, diwylliannol, creadigol a phersonol.

Mae Into Film yn cefnogi dysgu apelgar drwy ddarparu:

- Hyfforddiant DPP ar sail ffilm ar gyfer athrawon dan themâu gwneud ffilmiau a llythrennedd o ran ffilmiau
- Adnoddau addysgol i helpu athrawon i ddefnyddio ffilm yn yr ystafell ddosbarth
- Digwyddiadau rhyngweithiol sy'n ysbrydoli, dan arweiniad y diwydiant
- Cymorth i gynnal clybiau ffilmiau allgyrsiol rheolaidd - gall y rhain fod yn sgriniadau dan thema neu ddim ond am adloniant
- Mynediad i Wyl Into Film: yr wyl ffilm ieuenctid fwyaf yn y byd

Er mwyn gwella a chyfoethogi eu darpariaeth, mae gan Into Film Banel Ymgynghorol Ieuenctid i Gymru hefyd - rhwng 15 ac 20 o bobl ifanc 11-18 sy'n dod ynghyd 3 i 4 gwaith y flwyddyn (yng Nghaerdydd) i roi adborth am ein gwaith a llywio'n gweithgareddau yn y dyfodol. Yn ogystal, maent yn cynnig cyfleoedd i'r bobl ifanc hyn ddysgu mwy am y diwydiant ffilmiau drwy gymryd rhan mewn gweithdai gwneud ffilmiau, dysgu am adolygu ffilmiau, prosesau cynhyrchu ffilmiau a mynychu digwyddiadau gyda dawn y diwydiant ffilmiau.

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## *Young People's Brexit Survey & Question Time*

To discover the views of young people on Brexit, Young Wales, (Children in Wales' participation initiative) has produced a survey and will be hosting Question Time in October.

Young people between 10 and 20 will have the opportunity to quiz Minister for Children, Huw Irranca-Davies AM and relevant experts, at the Question Time event, which will be chaired by James Williams, BBC Cymru Wales Brexit Correspondent.

In addition the Young Wales Brexit survey covers where young people get their information about Brexit, what their concerns are, and what they think of the Welsh Government's priorities.

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## ***Children, Young People and Education Committee launch Welsh Baccaulaureate inquiry***

The National Assembly for Wales Committee on Children, Young People and Education has launched an inquiry into the benefits and disadvantages of the Welsh Baccaulaureate (Welsh Bacc).

The Committee will examine how the Baccaulaureate benefits learners, higher education and employers. They want to hear from anyone who had the option to study the Welsh Bacc from 2015 onwards.

The Committee has produced surveys for students and parents/guardians to complete.

They would like to hear from students how you feel about studying the Welsh Bacc and whether you think it will be beneficial to your education, employment and life.

From parents/guardians, they would like to hear your views of the qualification and its benefits or disadvantages for your child.

The survey will run until the 20<sup>th</sup> September 2018, and you can complete the survey [here](#).

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## ***UNICEF & Eurochild launch survey on the Europe Kids Want***

On 06 June 2018, Eurochild and UNICEF launched an online survey to capture the views of children and young people on the future of Europe.

'The Europe Kids Want' survey includes topics like children's experience of family-life, school, society, and their thoughts on Europe. It is written in child friendly language, in the hopes that this will encourage responses from under 18's.

The survey was developed by children's rights experts, and schools and other bodies working with children and young people are being encouraged to use the provided guidelines to stimulate discussions on the questions.

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## ***Welsh Government seeks views on proposals to reduce Wales' emissions***

The Welsh Government has opened a consultation on their new proposals to reduce emissions in Wales by 80% in 2050.

The proposals describe the targets that the Welsh Government will set between now and 2050, (to be approved by the National Assembly) and the plans that they will use to reduce emission.

The Welsh Government says a large proportion of Wales' energy still comes from fossil fuels and that we have a high proportion of heavy industry in Wales, and that there are a number of other challenges specific to Wales.

The Welsh Government's proposals include increasing the number of renewable sources of energy used to generate power in Wales, create a zero carbon travel network, encourage people in Wales to use electric vehicles, and to examine and use new technology in effective ways to help reduce our emissions.

The consultation also specifically asks young people for their views on the proposals. There is a young friendly version of the consultation, available [here](#), and at the end of that document, a [short survey for young people to fill out](#).

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## ***Into Film Cymru Youth Advisory Panel for Wales seeks new members***

Into Film is an education charity that seeks to put film at the heart of children and young people's learning and cultural experience. Their UK-wide programme provides 5-19 year olds with opportunities to see, think, make and imagine - contributing to their educational, cultural, creative and personal development.

Into Film supports engaging learning by providing:

- Film-based CPD training for teachers themed as filmmaking and film literacy
- Educational resources to help teachers use film in the classroom
- Inspirational and interactive industry-led events
- Support to run regular extra-curricular film clubs - these can be themed screenings or just for fun
- Access to the Into Film Festival : the largest youth film festival in the world

To enhance and enrich their provision Into Film also has a Youth Advisory Panel for Wales - between 15-20 young people aged 11-18 who come together 3 to 4 times a year (in Cardiff) to feedback on our work and steer our future activities. In addition, they provide opportunities for these young people to learn more about the film industry by taking part in filmmaking workshops, learning about film reviewing, film production processes and attend events with film industry talent.

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## ***'Don't Hold Back': New report on transitions to adulthood from Children's Commissioner for Wales***

The Children's Commissioner for Wales, Sally Holland, has published her report into transitions to adulthood for young people with learning disabilities.

The report compiles the experiences of young people, parents and carers and professionals on the need for government and public services to make sure that the aims of the Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act 2014 and the Well-Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 are implemented in the support given to young people with learning disabilities.

'Don't Hold Back' reports that the young people's participation in planning and decision making about them has been low, and that they face considerable changes in support after eighteen because different thresholds are used after that age, among other issues.

The report asks that ensuring that people with learning disabilities are able to take their place as active citizens is at the heart of services.
